- proceed to the appointed bay.



In September Donna Clark attended a Kenworth warranty training course in Melbourne. The course will allow Donna to assist Shane with placing warranty claims using the Kenworth computer system.

In October Daryl Fisher travelled to Kenworth— Melbourne to a course in Kenworth Air & Brake Systems and ABS. The air & brake course provided a basic understanding of the Kenworth air system and air suspension systems. While the ABS course provided a basic understanding of antilock brake system and developed problem solving skills in both areas.

Russell Twigden was also at Kenworth—Melbourne in October for a course in Kenworth Premier Care Electrical Systems and can now diagnose and repair faults associated with the electrical systems in a Kenworth.

MID-SEASON REPORT



Following an extremely successful rookie season in 2004/05 the current season has proven to be little tougher. But recently Dylan has bounced back & has put in a number of strong performances including a career best World Series result at Mildura & a third placing in the SA State Titles at Murray Bridge on 25 February.

October 2005

The season began on October 15 with a practice session at Murray Bridge. Throughout the night Dylan contested in three rounds of hot laps being among the quickest cars on the track.

November 2005

Jenkin Racing Team made their official start to the season at the Australian Sprintcar Masters at Speedway City. After qualifying in position 14 in the 27 car field, Dylan finished an impressive second & fifth placing in his heats. These results placed him thirteenth in the sixteen car feature but unfortunately his event ended on lap 19 after tagging the turn four wall, finishing in sixteenth position.

With no events programmed for several weeks, Dylan & the team decided to give their local sponsors & supporters a little extra exposure by hot lapping at the Tolmer Speedway in his hometown of Bordertown on November 19.

On November 26, Dylan was back in action at Speedway City for Round 4 of the World Series Sprintcar tour. The night started out in great fashion as he timed in as the seventh quickest, setting a quicker time than the likes of former Australian Champion Robbie Farr & American professional Jason Johnson. Following time trials, Dylan went on to secure a fifth & sixth placing in his heat races qualifying him on the front row for the B-Main. Starting from position two, Dylan had little trouble transferring to the final & after starting the 30 lap race from position fourteen, he worked his way steadily through the field to eventually finish up twelfth.

December 2005

Over the Christmas period, Jenkin Racing Team competed at three different venues throughout South Australia in three successive days with the outcome a little less than ideal.

Night One (December 26) was held at Speedway City & after setting a competitive time of 12.429 seconds, put Dylan inside the top ten. During his two heats he showed great car speed but once again had very little luck as he found himself just outside the automatic qualifiers list. Therefore, he started the B-Main from pole position & after a great start it all went wrong as the driveline failed on the car robbing the team of a certain feature start.

The following night, the team headed to Murray Bridge hoping for a change in luck but it turned out to be a frustrating night as Dylan found himself in the C-Main at the completion of the heats. Unfortunately that is where the night ended as a fellow competitor drove over the left front of Dylan's car bending the front axle.

The demanding schedule continued the following evening at Borderline Speedway in Mt Gambier. A second & a seventh placing in his two heats was an encouraging outcome. This placed Dylan into the B-Main & after a great dice with Mike Van Bremen & Cameron Gessner in the 15 lap race, Dylan was just edged out for top six finish, therefore just missing out on qualifying for the finale.

January 2006

The 2006 racing season was to have begun at Sungold Stadium in Warrnambool with two nights of racing on January 1 & 2, but after substantial rain on New Years Day, night one was cancelled. The number of cars on the second night made qualifying the most important part of the evening & Dylan rose to the occasion, setting a time well inside the top ten. With Dylan starting the heats at the back it was tough going, but he managed to grab two seventh placed results. This put him fourteenth in points, forcing him into the B-Main once again. This time Dylan had little trouble transferring as he finished second. Starting from the seventh row in the A-Main, Dylan ran a steady race eventually finishing in thirteenth position.

Making the final A-Main of the Speedweek Series & finishing 18th in the overall series points, was a fitting result for the team as they worked extremely hard over the Christmas period for little return & it gave them great confidence heading into the bigger races later in the month.

Less than a week later (January 7), the team headed to the Timmis Speedway at Mildura for the first time in their racing history & it proved to be a great night as Dylan managed to score a career best World Series Sprintcar feature result. After two solid heat results (Second & Fourth), Dylan got a spot in the A-Dash & later secured a seventh placed finish, defeating several of Australia's Sprintcar stars.

The Australia Day weekend saw Jenkin Racing Team return to competition, contesting in the Kings Sprintcar Challenge in Mt Gambier & the Grand Annual Sprintcar Classic at Warrnambool over three successive nights.

Unfortunately the Kings Challenge event once again saw Dylan finish extremely close to gaining a position in the 25 lap final as he finished two spots outside the transfer spot in the B-Main.

Night One of the Classic saw 55 cars turn up to Warrnambool to contest what is arguably the biggest Sprintcar race in Australia. With a straight draw rather than time trials, the heats were a bit of a lottery, but a fourth & a seventh position in his two heats was a commendable effort. These results sent him into the C-Main & as been the case on several occasions this season he just failed to move on as he finished in fifth position.

Night two of the Classic saw a majority of the meeting completed but just as Dylan was to push away for the B-Main, the rain set in washing out the remainder of the night. The event was then rescheduled for the Sunday morning but the rain continued putting an end to the entire event. With the Classic officially washed out, Dylan was left without a chance of starting in his first Grand Annual Sprintcar Classic final as he was set to start from position 12 in the B-Main.
