SA's Most Outstanding Small Employer



Tatiara Truck & Trailers was recently named SA's Small Employer of the Year at the State Training Awards. Held in Adelaide on September 12th, 400 attendees gathered to recognise the training achievements of organisations and individuals across the state.

Tatiara Truck & Trailers & Adelaide Casino jointly received the *Most Outstanding Employer* award. Despite competing against a larger organisation, with infinitely more resources, the judges were unable to determine a clear winner. Both finalists were noted to have sound training strategies which they displayed exceptional dedication to.



Tatiara Truck & Trailers was nominated due to the company's enduring commitment to upskilling staff across the business. At present, 4 training providers are being utilised to train mechanics, automotive electricians, spare parts interpreters and administration staff. In addition to this, supplier training is completed on a perpetual basis to remain update with innovations in technology. At the time of judging, 36% of staff were enrolled in formal training and the vast majority have attained qualifications or completed some official training throughout their employment at Tatiara Truck & Trailers.

The judges noted the culture of the company lends itself to upskilling, as younger members of staff are encouraged to guide work experience students. This teaches said apprentices the skills required to manage people and thus advancing their positions within the organisation and careers.

The long lasting relationship between Tatiara Truck & Trailers, Vtech and the Bordertown High School was highly regarded by the judges, with successful delivery of the work experience and VET program for spanning 17 years. The directors would like to make special thanks to Sue Walter for her dedication to her role as careers coordinator at Bordertown High. The work experience and VET programs are the foundations of this highly successful training strategy and the reason that many students have been able to evolve into skilled employees, valuable service providers and members of the community.


